Czech school's visit launches exchange programme

Teachers from both schools were able to share their teaching methods, a process that will continue when our students and staff pay a reciprocal visit to the Czech Republic. For many of our students, this will be the first time they will have travelled outside India.

In July, final year students set off on a journey of learning and adventure to the remote Nubra Valley. The 160-km route included one of the world's highest driveable roads, the Khardung La Pass. While exploring the Thang Valley, one of the most northerly parts of India, an elderly resident shared the history of the region, enriching the students' knowledge.



First Empathy Award presented among 2023 prizes

End of year results were announced on Proclamation Day held in the first week of November, with certificates and trophies presented by the chair of governors, His Eminence Thuksey Rinpoche. A new prize, the Empathy Award, was given to students who demonstrated exceptional empathy towards their classmates. Prizes for the Best Book Reader and Progressive Student were presented and the overall Best House trophy was awarded to Wisdom House.



Student delegates raise environment concerns at Delhi conference

In July, 72 student delegates from India's 28 states and 8 Union Territories attended the Model Conference of Parties in Delhi. The conference serves as a platform where young participants can raise their concerns about the environment and the theme for 2023 was Creating Green Networks. Building on the school's connection with the World Wide Fund for Nature-India (WWF India), two students from DPKS, Sonam Lanzes and Deachen Angmo with their teacher Stanzin Dolma were chosen to represent the Union Territory of Ladakh. They participated in interactive sessions and workshops, and presentations were given by representatives of WWF India. The conference aims to develop the idea of global citizenship among student delegates and help them devise action plans to solve local environmental challenges.

School officials visit London to launch design of new buildings

In October, the school principal, Mingur Angmo, travelled to London to attend a series of workshops to plan the long-awaited expansion designed to provide facilities for students up to the age of 18. As a starting point for the design process, Mingur -- on her first visit to the UK -- outlined the school's educational needs to the Arup design team. Also taking part was Drukpa Trust's sister charity, Live to Love International, to plan funding for the five-year programme. Four months later, the construction director, Sonam Angdus, attended follow-up meetings with Arup and Drukpa Trust in London to review the detailed design of the new buildings ahead of this year's construction season.

Residential buildings on target to complete in 2024

Last year two resident engineers from Arup joined the team to work on the penultimate year of the refurbishment and seismic upgrade of the residences. Work continued at a fast pace, paving the way for completion of all residential buildings by the end of this year.

After two years of planning, design and initial fundraising we were delighted that the foundations for the first new building were laid in April. The intensive five-year construction programme 2024-28 required the recruitment of an experienced site engineer and Pranav Tyagi has been engaged to join the senior management team, headed by Sonam Angdus.
